ABOUT THE ULUMBARRA FOUNDATION

The Ulumbarra Foundation is a Bendigo-based charity which creates opportunities for performing arts organisations, artists and audiences in the region. Since 2016, our programs and grants have invested over \$150,000 to:

- scale and support small performing arts organisations
- create opportunities to mentor artists and develop the skills of young people
- broaden access to performing arts experiences for disadvantaged and new audiences
- enhance venue capability and the audience experience

The Ulumbarra Foundation is seeking to fill a number of voluntary roles on the Board and Sub-Committees as serving directors reach their maximum terms over the next few years. As a Director, you'll play a critical role alongside other Board members in the implementation of the organisation's ambitious strategy.

SELECTION CRITERIA

As a skills-based Board, the Ulumbarra Foundation particularly encourages candidates who will contribute to the implementation of our strategy as we enter our growth phase. Nominations from the community with specific expertise and capability in the following areas are encouraged:

- fundraising
- philanthropic networks
- marketing and communications
- governance
- digital technology

To be considered for this role you will have:

- the personal skills to communicate and work with other Board members and the Executive Officer in a constructive and supportive manner
- the capacity to use your own networks and contacts to increase the organisation's reach and impact
- an interest in the performing arts and a desire to make a difference
- a commitment to our vision for Bendigo as Australia's most vibrant regional performing arts community

Applications from young people and indigenous and culturally diverse communities are welcome. Board members are expected to attend six meetings a year (hybrid) and participate in one of the Board subcommittees. Service on the Ulumbarra Foundation Board is without remuneration. The Board is supported by a part time Executive Officer (EO) but the ability to contribute time and resources to work in a hands-on manner is expected.
